

2. Description of Co-Curricular Activities Program

Leipzig International School's Co-Curricular Activities (CCA) Program is designed to complement the academic programme and provide students with an opportunity to learn skills beyond the classroom. 2.1 Overview of Dates

The Co-Curricular Activities (CCA) are part of the school programme made possible by the Leipzig International School community. The community includes parents, students, teachers and external providers.

Participation in CCA is voluntary and open to all students at LIS and LISK (most activities are targeted at certain sections of the school – i.e. Kindergarten, Primary and Secondary, or specific grade levels within each section).

2.1.1 Hours

CCAs are activities that take place mainly after school and during the opening hours of 15:15 - 17:00, although some activities are also offered at weekends.

CCAs are generally in 45min, 1hour or 1.5hr blocks depending on the activity.

Certain holiday activities are organised for a number of age groups during the Autumn, Winter and Spring Breaks and are communicated throughout the school year ahead of time.


Prior to the start of each term, parents will have the chance to sign their children up for the courses via the school's information management system: Engage.

3. Expectations

The following outlines the expectations of the providers, parents and students in the delivery and participation in the CCA programme.

3.1 Expectations of the Instructors / Providers

Please ensure that you follow the rules and procedures outlined below:

- Safety 1st, be aware of and follow safety procedures information on fire and evacuation procedures, lock down instances and safeguarding concerns can be found within this manual. You are required to read and familiarise yourself with this before delivering your sessions.
- Protect the students physical and mental health and wellbeing
- Enjoy and share your passion
- Be prepared and on time to deliver your sessions
- Liaise with the Co-Curricular Coordinator and relevant school section as appropriate
- Inform the CCA coordinator when calling in sick putting the relevant school section in copy
- Check daily matters arising with the reception desk
- Take an attendance register at the beginning of the activity this is both a safeguarding measure so students' whereabouts are known and communicated as well as an administrative necessity for payment and invoicing.
- Inform parents in case of your absence
- Supervise your students at all times
- Be flexible and make adjustments to students' needs as appropriate. For example, a student who does not want to play a game might keep score, be a "referee,".
- Have a positive attitude which can inspire students to achieve their dreams.

3.2 Expectations of students

- Attend Regularly: Students are expected to attend all scheduled sessions unless there is a valid reason for absence, such as illness or a family emergency. Signing up for an enrichment activity is a sign of commitment that should be respected and followed.
- Be On Time: Arrive at the enrichment activity on time, prepared, and ready to participate.
- Engage Actively: Participate actively and positively in all activities, showing enthusiasm and a willingness to learn.
- Follow Safety Procedures: Adhere to all safety instructions and procedures outlined by the instructors, including fire and evacuation procedures, lockdown protocols, and safeguarding measures.
- Respect Instructors, peers and the learning environment: Show respect to the instructors, peers, and any equipment or materials used during the activity.
- Communicate Effectively: Inform the instructor or the Co-Curricular Coordinator in advance if they are unable to attend a session or if they need to leave early.
- Complete Assigned Tasks: Complete any tasks or assignments given during the enrichment activity to the best of their ability.
- Maintain a Positive Attitude: Approach the activities with a positive attitude and be open to trying new things and learning from experiences.
- Collaborate and Support Peers: Work cooperatively with peers, offering help and support when needed and fostering a collaborative learning environment.
- Follow School Policies: Abide by the general school policies and codes of conduct while participating in the enrichment activity.

- Take Responsibility for Personal Belongings: Ensure that personal belongings are kept safe and tidy during the activity sessions. Secondary students have lockers that should be used for their belongings, primary students should follow the procedures outlined by the Hort organisation
- Seek Help When Needed: Reach out to instructors or the Co-Curricular Coordinator if they have any concerns, questions, or need additional support regarding the activity.

By adhering to these expectations, students can ensure a productive, enjoyable, and safe experience in their enrichment activities, contributing positively to their personal development and the enrichment program as a whole.

3.3 Expectations of parents

It is imperative that, as parents, you discuss the activities on offer with your children and are aware of the choices they have made and the days of the week this affects. We, as a school, will be sure to monitor the students, to ensure they are balancing their workload and activities.

- Make sure they and their child understand the program expectations.
- Enrol their child before the semester begins in communication and agreement with their child
- Keep and respond to open communication with the club provider at all times.
- Notify the CCA Coordinator and relevant section pf the school if their child will be absent or late.
- Ensure that their child is prepared for the activity on the relevant days of activity.
- Allowing their son/daughter to be accountable for their actions.
- Collect their child on time.
- Pay fees on time (if necessary, depending on activities chosen).
- Check email for messages from the school/ provider.
- Support staff decisions towards their son/daughter's success.

4. Parent / Student registration

The registration is made via engage. You will find a guide on the parent portal – engage under websites – engage guide for parents. Please understand that for safety reason most activities are limited by maximum student numbers. At the same time we have a minimum number of students required to provide our activities.

Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs) at LIS are for LIS students only. LIS parents and guardian's sign-up their child in advance via the Engage parent portal.

When registering via Engage, parents have the opportunity to share their preferences for activities by day. Activities are selected in order of preference: 1st is the preferred activity, followed by the 2nd and 3rd choices.

LIS colleagues then assign spots and create the groups based on these applications and on a random allocation basis. When the registration has been fully processed, the CCA Coordinator will share all details with the families as well as the instructors of the participating students using engage.

At the same time LIS will keep a waiting list for your activity. If during the year, a vacancy becomes available, students on the waiting list will be contacted with the option of filling this spot. The LIS coordinators will maintain a waiting list and will work to fill that space and then inform you if a space becomes available.

Students can only register via the above procedures.

4.1 Trial period and cancellation by parents

After the registration period is over there will be trial weeks. This allows students to explore multiple offers and hopefully supports their decision making. Trial weeks are free of charge. Once the trial weeks are over, the full activity fee is due.

To ensure that a student really enjoys their activity, LIS offers a 2-week trial period.

If parents wish to cancel the course after the trial period, they must do so in writing to the relevant school section and activity provider.

4.2 Waiting List

After the maximum number of participants for an activity has been reached, there will be a waiting list automatically created. If a child is on a waiting list, he or she can't register for another activity that takes place at the same day and time.

If parents/guardian cancel an activity before term starts or during trial period, the first student on the waiting list will automatically be assigned to the activity.

4.3 Cancelling an Activity

If you or your child decide that you do not like the chosen course after trying it out, you can easily cancel it during the trial period in the first two weeks of each term. Please do this in writing via engage or email to the appropriate after school section and CCA Coordinator.

If you wish to cancel the course after trial period is over, you need to do this in writing via engage to the appropriate after school activities office and CCA Coordinator. Once the trial weeks are over, the full activity fee (if applicable) is due.

4.4 Communication

The communication is mainly via the parent portal engage. We will inform you about updates, changes, and cancelation of activities as early as possible.

Please communicate your child's absence or any other important details to the provider and appropriate after school activities office.

5. Individual Music Lesson - Learning a Musical Instrument at LIS

At Leipzig International School we give our students the opportunity to experience the joy of expressing themselves through music by offering a wide variety of instrumental lessons. These lessons are taught by hand-picked professionals after the academic lessons are over and conveniently take place in our school building from 15:20 until 21:00h.

Lesson fees are 20 Euros per 30 minutes. More detailed information regarding payment method or lesson cancellation is available in the teaching agreement for individual music lessons.

Once we have received your response, we will be in touch to link you up with the correct instrument specialist.

5.1 Organisation of Individual Music Lessons

Individual music lessons are coordinated through contact with parents, providers, the Director of Music and the CCA Coordinator.

Should a child be unable to attend a lesson for whatever reason, families must communicate this to the provider, relevant school section and the CCA Coordinator more that 24hrs before the scheduled lesson. **Cancellations after this time will still be charged.**
